What is the Cancer Council Information Centre?

The Cancer Council Information Centre is a facility located within the Southern Highlands Specialist Centre and Cancer Centre that offers a friendly, comfortable space for cancer patients and their friends and family to access additional relevant cancer information and a range of support services tailored to their needs. Visitors to the Centre can include anyone affected by cancer, at any stage of the cancer journey.

Who do visitors see?

The Cancer Council Information Centre is staffed by specially trained volunteers, managed by the Cancer Council. Volunteers are easily identifiable by uniforms and/or name badges.

Many patients are already receiving relevant information from their healthcare teams. We are seeking to supplement, not replace, that information provision.

What information can visitors receive?

The Cancer Council Information Centre would provide an opportunity to access accurate, reliable cancer information in the form of printed materials, books and DVDs, as and when patients are ready to engage with it. Internet facilities would also enable access to credible cancer related web sites. Access to the Cancer Council Helpline is available on-site.

The Cancer Council Information Centre also provides additional access to information for family and friends, who may not necessarily always have the opportunity to receive this directly from health professionals.
